The [English](#) again captured Mangalore in 1791, but Tippu besieged it in 1793 and the English surrendered the city in 1794. With the death of Tippu Sultan and the fall of [Srirangapatna](#)

during the

[Fourth Anglo-Mysore War](#)

in 1799, the city was re-conquered by the British, and it remained under British administration till India's independence in 1947.

British administration

The city had a peaceful administration under [British rule](#) and permanent visible improvements effected during this period. It flourished gradually in [education](#) and in [industry](#) and became a commercial centre for [export](#) and

[import](#)

and

trade. The linking of Mangalore, in 1907, with the

[Southern Railway](#)

and later the advent of motor vehicles further increased the trade and communication with the rich hinterland. The opening of the

[Basel Mission](#)

in 1834 brought many industries into the city.
